On the 14th of March 2023, in a collaborative effort, the Meenachil Nadi Samrakshana Samithi joined hands with the Bhoomithrasena Club of Henry Baker College, Melukavu, to establish a Climate Action Group. The occasion was graced by the presence of Dr. Beena Paul, Principal-in-Charge, who presided over the event. Dr. Ramesh Kumar M.R, Chief Scientist at CSIR's National Institute of Oceanography, inaugurated the activities of the Climate Action Group and delivered a lecture on the theme "**Climate Crisis and Remedies.**"

The modern world confronts a pressing issue in the form of climate change, with concerns including global warming, air pollution, rising sea levels, and the heightened incidence of natural calamities like floods, hurricanes, and droughts. As an integral part of the Climate Change Seminar organized by the BhoomithraSena Club, Dr. Ramesh Kumar M.R, a Chief Scientist who has retired from CSIR's National Institute of Oceanography, presented an insightful address on various aspects of climate change. In his inaugural address, he underscored that while international and national initiatives are underway to combat the climate crisis, local endeavors with active community engagement deserve recognition. Dr. Ramesh Kumar highlighted the commendable contributions of local communities, particularly emphasizing the efforts of the Meenachil River Rain Monitoring Network in battling the climate crisis.

As an integral part of the Meenachil River Rain Monitoring Network's activities, rain gauges were thoughtfully distributed among the CLAP members of the Bhoomithrasena Club, residing across the 13 wards of Melukavu Panchayat. These gauges function by capturing rainwater in a funnel-shaped collector, which then transfers the water to a measuring tube. The dedicated volunteers regularly record precipitation patterns and update their findings through the Climate Action Group's official WhatsApp channel. This practice significantly aids in monitoring the region's rainfall trends, thereby contributing to a comprehensive understanding of local climatic changes. Furthermore, this initiative serves to cultivate a sense of shared responsibility in addressing climate change and working towards a sustainable future.

The event was graced by the presence of Dr. S. Ramachandran, President of Meenachil Nadi SamrakshanaSamithi, Sri. Eby Emmanuel, Coordinator of Meenachil River Rain Monitoring Network, Sri Justin Jose, Teacher Coordinator of BhoomithraSena Club, and Sri. Amal Joseph, Student Coordinator of the BhoomithraSena Club. The seminar was organized

with the intention of involving students and faculty from diverse disciplines, fostering a holistic approach to the urgent matter of climate change.

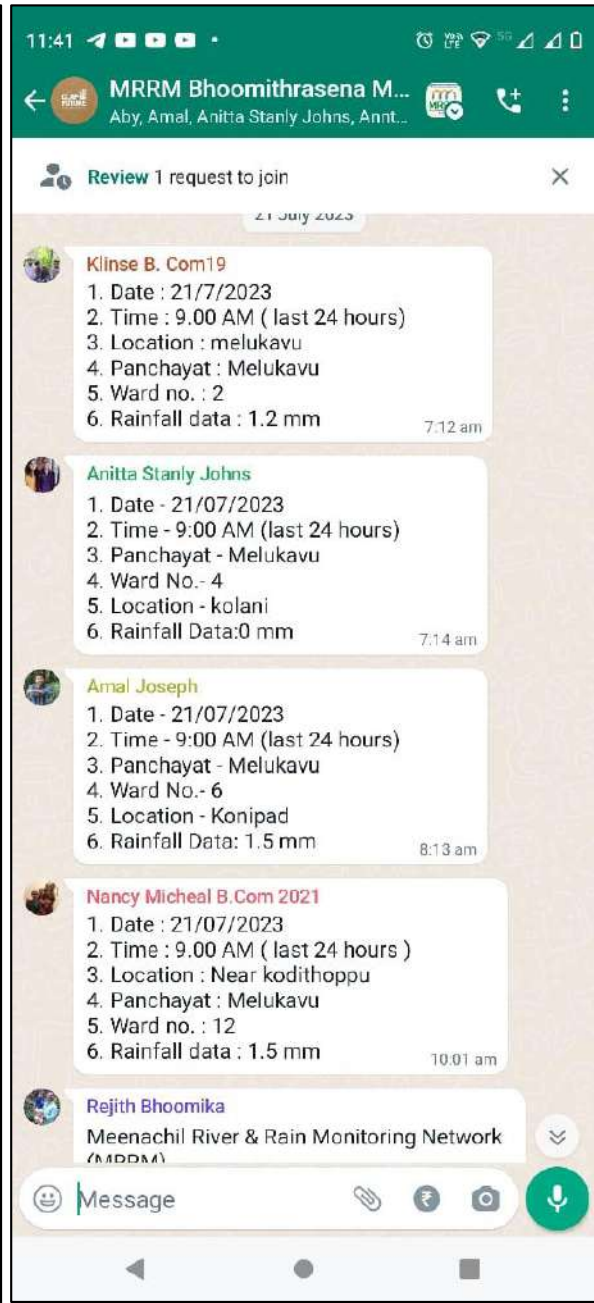
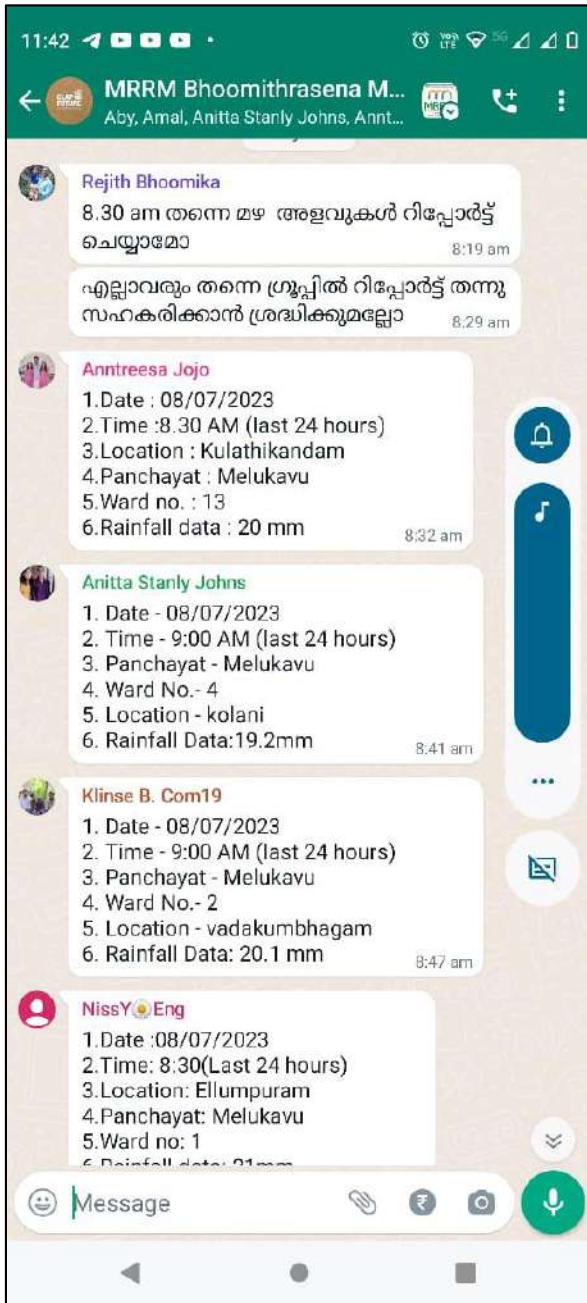

About the College

Henry Baker College, Melukavu is Christian, Minority, Co-educational, Government Aided Arts and Science College established in 1981. The college is named after Rev. Henry Baker (Dr.), the pioneering CMS missionary, often known as the Apostle of the Hills, who led the people of this locality from darkness to light. It is owned, managed and run by the Henry Baker Educational Society of the C.S.I. East Kerala Diocese and is instituted to impart quality education primarily to the marginalized and the voiceless sections. The college was founded in 1981 by the C. S. I. Madhya Kerala Diocese providing two year Pre-Degree Courses of Kerala University. Later on, the College was permanently affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University in 1983, upgraded in 1991 and became a first grade college in 1999. Special consideration is given to the students of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, to prepare them light a beacon of humaneness in this turbulent age. It has moulded the destiny of hundreds of people for a better tomorrow and has emerged as a leading centre for teaching, learning and research in the field of higher education. The college is an ISO 9001- 2015 certified institution and accredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade in 2021.

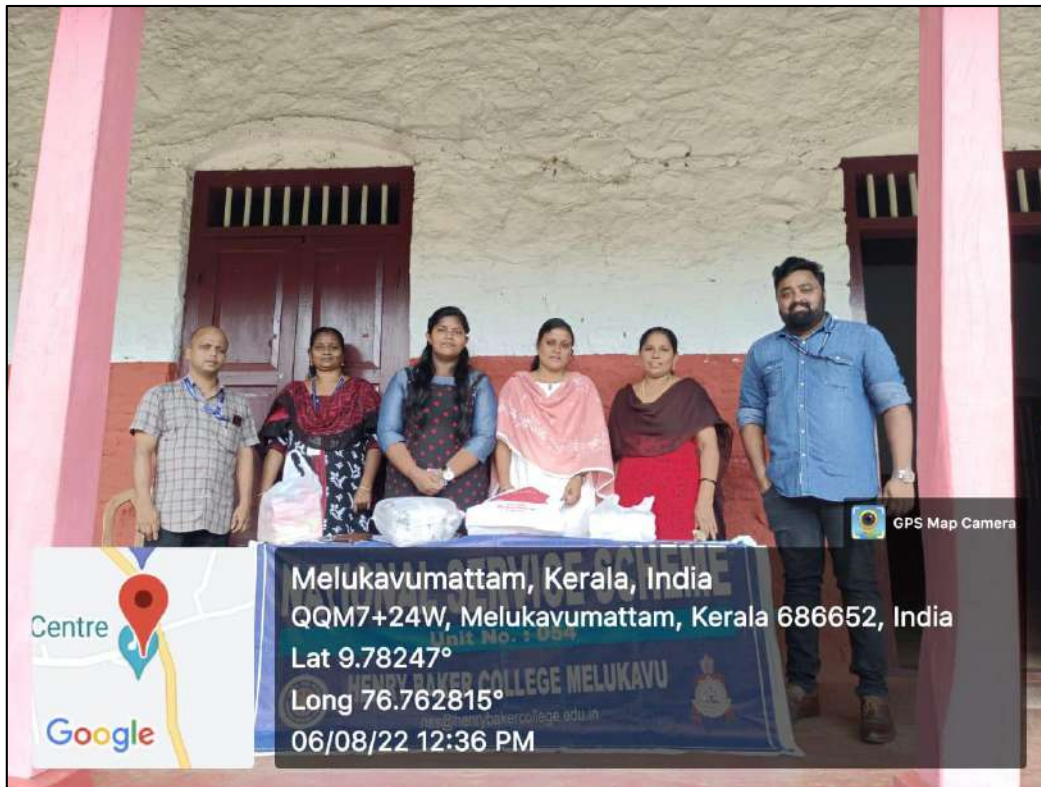

Cleaning and disinfecting after flooding is a major undertaking. The NSS Unit of Henry Baker College, cleaned the Government Ayurveda Dispensary, Moonilavu Gramapanchayat on 08.08.2022. Our volunteers removed the flood waters inside the hospital and washed thoroughly. Floors, toilets, walls, tables, chairs and benches were thoroughly cleaned with hot soapy water and disinfected the surfaces with chlorine bleach solution. It was an arduous task as the floodwater carried silt, sewage and other wastes that can cause bacterial, viral or parasitic diseases. They sanitized and disinfected the vials. They discarded the items that absorbed the flood water and could not be cleaned or disinfected. The volunteers' efforts to re-arrange the medicines and other articles in the hospital were commendable. 18 students participated in the programme.

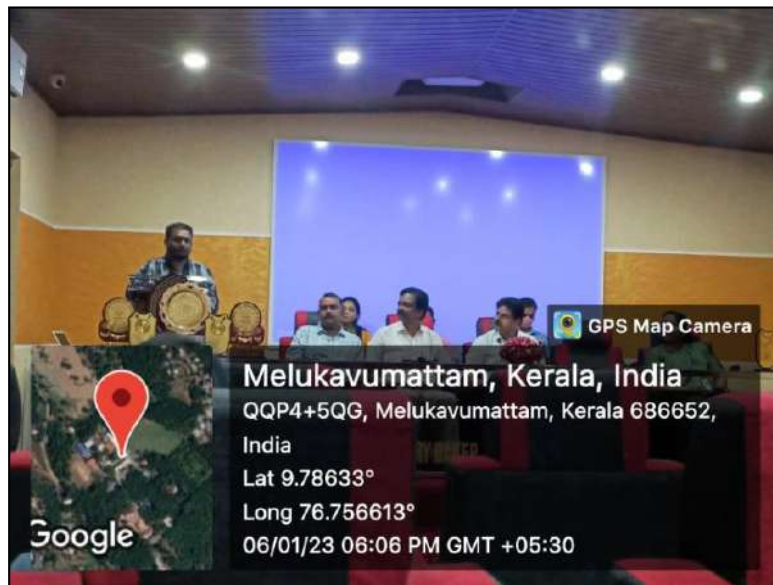

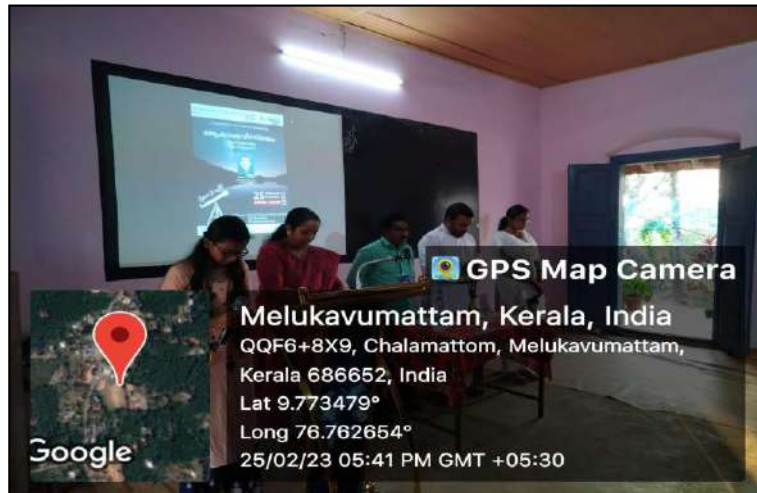

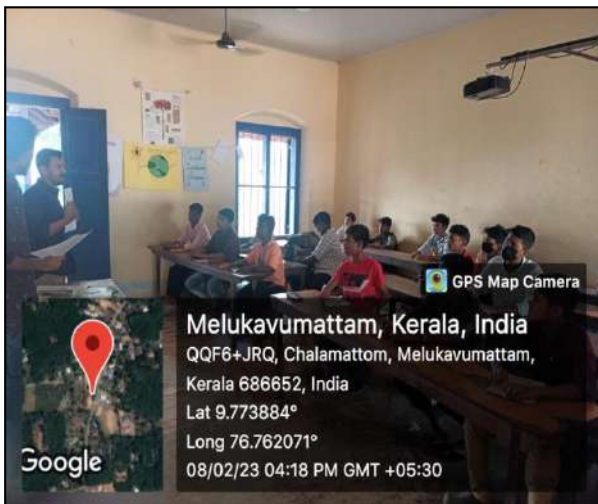

Objective

To be part of the Local History Collective and also to lead the academic discussions related to the history of the Meenachil River.

Postgraduate Department of History, along with Kottayam Nattukoottam, Meenachil Nadheesamrakshanasamithi, Bhoomika Poonjar and Kerala Pradesika Charitra Samithioraganised a History seminar on “Meenachil Nadheethadathinte Charitram” in Bhoomika Centre, Poonjar on 23rd April 2023 at 2.00 pm. For the last few decades, environmentalists and activists have been very much concerned about the protection of the Meenachil River which is an important river flowing through the Meenachil Taluk and serves as the nerve centre of the region. Parallel to this Kottayam Nattukoottam and Kerala Pradesika Charitrasamithi are interested in the history of the Meenachil riverbed. As a higher education institution, the Postgraduate Department of History was associated with the team in order to enhance their historical knowledge about the Meenachil riverbed.

The programme started with the welcome speech of Dr. S. Ramachandran, President, Meenachil Nadheesamrakshanasamithi. Sri. George Mathew Adhyalil, Panchayath President of Poonjar Thekkara, presided over the meeting. The major attraction of the programme was the honouring of Sri. Thomas Kunnickal, a native of Poonjar reported many megalithic findings from the region. After the honouring, he talked about the various artifacts he had found from the places as well as the negligence of the people and the government regarding the protection of megalithic monuments and the sites that prove the prehistoric inhabitation in the region. The History Seminar was inaugurated by Dr. Beena Paul, HOD, Department of History, Henry Baker College, Melukavu. She first of all appreciated the people who were assembled there to hear about the history of the Meenachil River. She also summarized the history of the people who lived around the river from the past to the present. The main presentation in the Seminar was by Pallikonam Rajeev, Coordinator, Kerala Pradesika Charitra Samithi. He talked about Meenachil **Nadheethadathinte Charitram**. Another talk in the session was by Dr. Nisha Joseph, Assistant

Professor, Department of History, HBC, Melukavu. She talked on the subject “Paristhithika Veenduvicharathinte Charitram Sangalpanagalum”. The seminar ended at 6.00pm.5 Students participated in the programme.

Outcome

Local people who are interested in the protection of the Meenachil River got the opportunity to learn about the history of Meenachil River and the two teachers of the Postgraduate department were part of the programme to impart the history of the river basin to the natives.

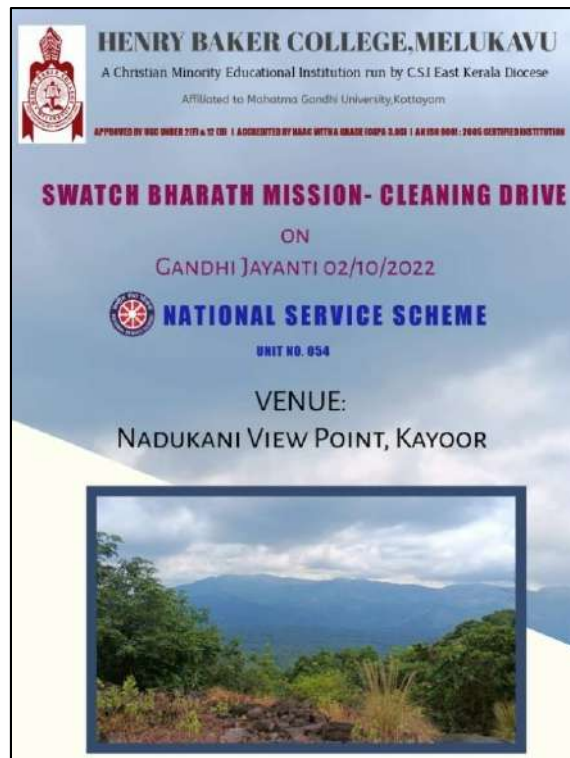
