MOOC Courses- College is a local chapter of NPTEL and advanced learners are motivated to attend SWAYAM/NPTEL courses.


RESULT OF JANUARY – JUNE 2020 SESSION OF SWAYAM (HBC'S FIRST SWAYAM NPTEL BATCH)

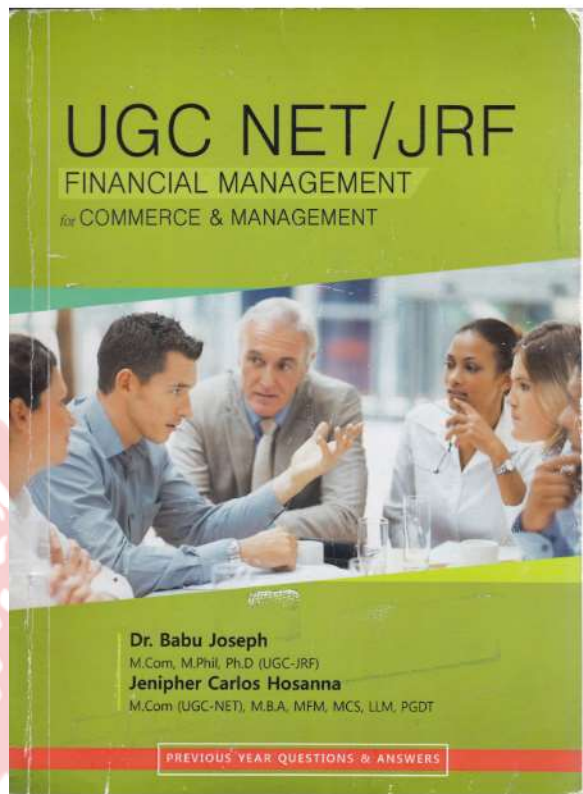
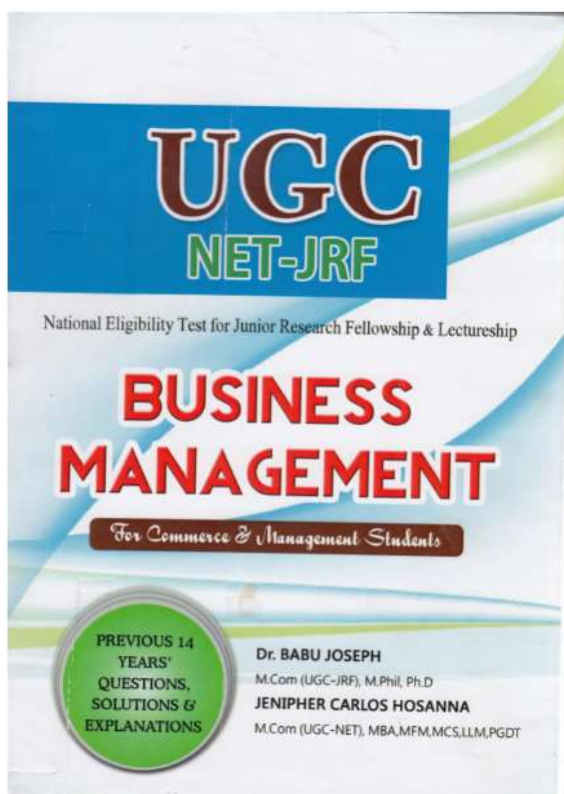

WALK WITH A SCHOLAR PROGRAMME

CONSOLIDATED REPORTS--2015-2020

WWS Scheme is a new initiative of the Board of Higher Education aiming to make our students competent enough to perform better in their career. WWS proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programs for UG students and to provide guidance for their future. The scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to bright students who can excel in their disciplines, to give them necessary guidance, motivation and mental support to identify appropriate areas for higher study as well as future employment. The scheme also envisages in making the students competent to proceed and to evolve ways to achieve their targets of knowledge acquisition and employment.

Thirty students from First year of the UG programme will be selected to this scheme and divided into groups. For the purpose of mentoring, two categories of mentors are identified: 'Internal Mentors' and External Mentors'. Internal Mentors are faculty from the College itself and they are persons who are able to do mentoring and support the scholars and act as a guide in building their career. External Mentors are reputed persons outside the College and from various professions. Their experience and expertise will help the students to identify a better career option. The scheme also envisages in making the students competent to proceed and to evolve ways to achieve their targets of knowledge acquisition and employment.

Sri. Paul Mathews Dept. of English continued to be the coordinator of WWS during 2014-2017. At present, there are 90 mentees under this scheme and 12 teachers of the college are deputed as internal mentors of these mentees. Each mentor is assigned the charge of six mentees. Prof. Ansa Andrews and Prof. Ashly Mereena Mathew attended the cluster workshop for the internal mentors at Newman College, Thodupuzha on 20.01.2017. Mr. Franklin Sam Francis of II year B. A. English attended the state motivation camp FOCUS 2017 at Chaithanya Camp Centre, Thellakom from 20.01.2017 through 22.01.2017.

Mr. Alexander S. is an assistant professor of English at Mangalam College of Engineering and a Language trainer. He took three sessions on Communication Skills on 07.01.2017. Mr.JayadevaVarma, Grandson of renowned Malayalam poet Ambalapuzha Rama Varma, is a trainer of competitive exams. Mr.Varma gave our students an orientation towards the successful mastering of general awareness for various competitive exams. Those sessions were taken on 14.01.2017 forenoon. Mr.Saju Thomas, a retired hand from the central sector engaged the afternoon sessions on How to Crack PSC Exams. He shared his knowledge in the career options in central government sector. His expertise in the field was exploited by our students. Mr. Jins Joseph, career guidance expert of Trinity Academy, Athirampuzha, gave an outline of career opportunities in public sector on 21.01.2017 Saturday. Altogether we conducted fourteen sessions (hours) of external mentoring for our students.

In 2018-19, sixty students were selected from the first year and second year UG classes. Ms. Elizabeth Joseph, Asst. Professor in English was appointed as the college level coordinator. Sri. Korah Jacob (Asso. Prof. in Economics), Smt. Dona Sebastian (Asso. Prof.

in English), Dr.Disha V.J (Asso.Prof.in Chemistry), Dr.Santo Jose(Asst. Prof. in Commerce),Dr.Nisha Joseph(Asst. Prof. in History) were selected as Internal Mentors for the I year students. Smt. Ajitha V.R (Asso.Prof. in Hindi), Sri. Shinu Thomas P (Asst. Prof in commerce) Smt. Ashly Mereena Mathew (Asst. Prof. in Commerce), Mr.KrishnadasChinnappan (Guest Lecturer) in History),Ms.Ardra .S. Nair(Guest Lecturer in Physics) were selected as Internal mentors for the II Year students.

On 10/09/2018 a one day orientation programme was arranged for the coordinators of WWS at Loyola College TVM and Prof. Elizabeth Joseph represented our institution. According to the Guidelines given there a monitoring cell was formed in the college on 19/9/2018.During the inaugural ceremony, applications were invited and 60 students were selected from different departments on the basis of their marks from plus two. The mentees were grouped into six according to their interests and each internal mentor was given charge of each group.

A one day orientation Programme was conducted for the internal mentors on 8/10/18 at Govt. College Nattakom as per the direction from the office of New Initiatives in Higher Education.Three of our Internal Mentors attended the Programme. Smt. Ajitha V.R, Dr.Disha V.J and Mr.KrishnadasChinnappan represented our institution. The mentors were highly motivated and inspired by the orientation class.

After obtaining approval from the college level monitoring committee, External mentoring sessions were arranged on Saturdays. 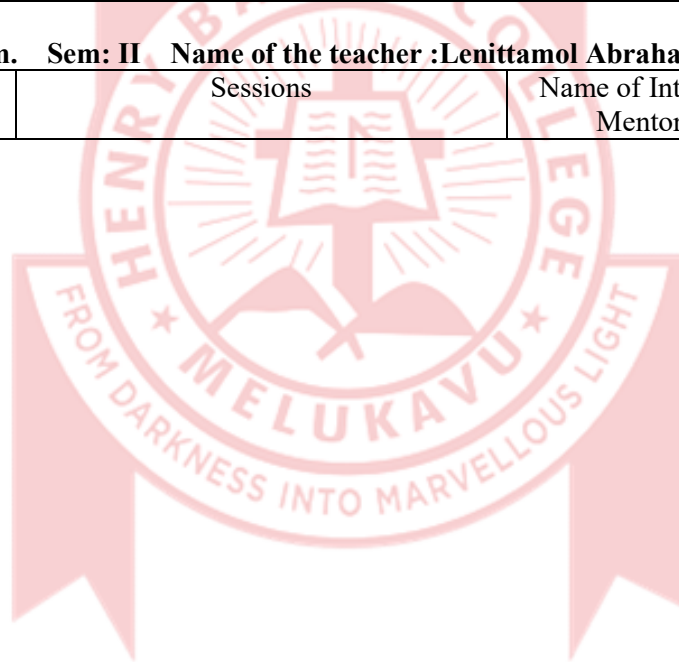
