

## **CAMPAIGNS**

## 1. WORLD POPULATION DAY

World Population Day, a day to focus attention on the urgency and importance of population issues. NSS unit of Henry Baker College in association with Public Health centre, Edamarukuorganised World population day awareness class on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2015. On the day an invited talk on organised on "Women and Health Care in the Present World Scenario". Dr. Bibiraj C., Assistant Surgeon, CHC, Edamaruku, was the chief guest and Mr. Sakeer KB Health Inspector presided over the meeting. 75 students and 5 teachers attended the programme.



## 2. ANTIDRUG & ANTI-TOBACCO AWARENESS PROGRAMME

On 17<sup>th</sup> July 2015, National Service Scheme, Henry Baker College, Melukavu in association with Community Health Centre, Edamarukuorganised an Antidrug& Antitobacco awareness seminar and rally. The purpose of the programme was to make people aware of drug abuses and create a society free of tobacco. The programme was inaugurated by Principal Dr. Anieyamma Varghese, and Dr. BibirajC,Community Health Centre, Edamaruku delivered presidential address. 70 students and 7 teachers participated in the programme.



## 3. AMRUTHAM AROGYAM

An awareness class and a rally against lifestyle diseases were conducted on 14/12/2015 in association with Edamaruku Health centre. Eighty students and six teachers participated in the programme.



## 4. WOMEN'S FEST 2016

Women's Fest 2016 was a programme exclusively organised for the girl students of the college on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2016. The programme was also attended by the members of Kudumbasree unit of Melukavu Gramapanchayath and students of nearby schools. The objective of the programme was to honour the women achievers who excelled in various fields such as politics, academics etc. 225 students and 22 teachers participated in the programme. The main sessions were:

Final round was conducted at college auditorium on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2016 at 10 am. Fifty four students and 5 teachers participated in the programme.

It was a programme to create more awareness among the general public and the students for organic farming and healthy food habits. MelukavuGrampanchayath Members, Diocesan Executive Members, Unit members of Kudumbasree and Staff and students of the college participated in the programme. 348 Students participated in the programme.



# 8. ORGAN DONATION AWARENESS PUBLIC CAMPAIGN (23<sup>RD</sup> AUGUST 2016)

Department of Commerce organized an organ donation awareness campaign at Melukavumattom town on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2016. CSI East Kerala Diocese Treasurer Rev. V.S. Francis inaugurated the programme. An organ donar Rev. Fr. Sebastian Kidangathazhedelivered the keynote address. Dr. Tharsis Joseph (CMD Deepika), Rev. Justin Mony (Clergy Secretary, CSI East Kerala Diocese), Priests, Management representatives, Grama Panachayathu Members and Staff Members were present in the programme. 300 students and 24 teachers attended the programme.

## 11. FOOTBALL MATCH AGAINST LIFE STYLE DISCEASES

A Football match was organised to create awareness against life style diseases on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2017. Citizen's Arts & Sports Club Chalamattom and NSS Volunteers from Henry Baker College were the contestants. This program was organised in association with CHC Edamaruku. Melukavu Gramapanchayath president Kumari Sheebamol Joseph inaugurated the tournament. Mr. Shakeer KB felicitated the match. Lifestyle diseases are ailments that are primarily based on the day to day habits of people. Habits that detract people from activity and push them towards a sedentary routine can cause a number of health issues that can lead to chronic non-communicable diseases that can have near life-threatening consequences. This match was to make people aware of how to follow a healthy life style



## 12. COTPA OBSERVATION DAY- ANTI- TOBACCO AWARENESS RALLY

The Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution) Act, 2003 or COTPA, 2003 is an Act of government of India enacted in 2003 to prohibit advertisement of, and to provide for the regulation of trade and commerce in, and production, supply and distribution of cigarettes and other tobacco products in India. National Service Scheme, HBC also observed 31st May 2018 as anti-tobacco day under COTPA 2003. 200 NSS volunteers and 7 teachers participated in the rally. It was a joint endeavour of CHC, Edamaruk, MelukavuGramapanchayath and NSS HBC.





## 13. MONSOON MARATHON

As part of the Environment Day, a marathon was conducted by the Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management on 10 June 2019. The motto of the program was 'Heal the Earth, Heal the Future' by preserving the Environment. The marathon was officially inaugurated by the college principal Dr. G. S. Gireesh Kumar by giving a meaningful message about our responsibility towards the environment and the need to preserve it. 25 students from different colleges participated in this programme as part of responsible tourism. The first and second prize was secured by Christ College, Irinjalikuda and Alphonsa College, Pala. Fifty students and five staff actively participated for the successful completion of the programme.





## 14. VALICHERIYAL MUKTHA CAMPUS-NAGARAM PROGRAMME

Based on the direction from MG University, Kottayam, our NSS unit organized *ValicheriyalMuktha Campus-Nagaram* Programme on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2019. Purpose of the programme was to make the pupil and the public aware of the need for cleanliness; which will otherwise damage our environment and our future. On the occasion students distributed notices to the shopkeepers and the public at Melukavumatton town. Seventy eight volunteers and four teachers very actively participated in the programme.







#### 15. BREAST CANCER AWARENESS PROGRAMME



Breast cancer is by far the most common cancer in women worldwide irrespective of the status of the country viz. developed, developing, least-developed, or heavily indebted. In low income and middle-income countries, the incidence has been rising up steadily in the last few years due to increase in life expectancy, increase in urbanization and westernization.

In Association with Govt. Medical College, Kottayam and NSS Unit of Henry Baker College organized a programme on breast cancer awareness on 24<sup>nd</sup> June 2019, named SAKHI. This was a very useful programme for all the student volunteers and Kudumbashree members. 42 students and 15 Kudumbashree members participated.





## 16. WORLD OZONE DAY CELEBRATION

Department of Physics, in association with Nature club of Henry Baker College celebrated World Ozone Day on 19 September 2018 with the support of Kerala State

Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) based on the focal theme "keep cool and carry on! The Montreal Protocol". The objective of this venture was to raise awareness and give prominence towards preservation of ozone layer to young minds.

The one-day programme was conducted in two sessions. The session-I constitute the inaugural function followed by an invited lecture. The session-II comprised of Film Show, Intercollegiate Power-Point Presentation Competition and valedictory function. Dr. V. P. Sylas, Asst. Professor, School of Environmental Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam delivered a lecture on the topic 'Ozone Depletion and Climate Change'. He discussed on various topics related to ozone depletion and factors responsible for climate change.

Session-II started with the Film Show (video clips) which creates awareness on the cause, impact of ozone layer depletion and clips related to Montreal Protocol. An Intercollegiate Power-Point Presentation competition was held in the afternoon based on the focal theme "keep cool and carry on! The Montreal Protocol". 13 teams from nearby colleges participated in the event. 75 students participated in the celebration.



## 17. NSS@50- NATIONAL INTEGRATION RALLY

NSS' golden jubilee was celebrated on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and as part of it a public meeting was organized at Melukavumattom town and a National Integration Rally from Melukavumattom to college was also organised. In the public meeting Dr.G.SGireeshkumar, principal of the college delivered the message. 210 students and 3 teachers participated in the program.


The objectives of the program were:

- 3. St: Joseph HSS, Paingottoor










## 19.CYBER SAFE SEMINAR (28 Nov.2019)

primarily intended to safeguard the campus community from internet risks associated with cyber space. The programme was conducted in association with Police department, Students cadets(SPC), Scoutes and Guides, Cyber experts, staff and students. 

## 3. VISIT TO SANTHINILAYAM ORPHANAGE




## 15. A RUPEE A DAY' PROGRAMME


## 16. ONE DAY MEAL TO VISRANDHINILAYAM ON CHRISTMAS.


# 4. FOOD FOR THE MELUKAVU GRAMAPANCHAYATH MEMBERS.

# **BLURRING THE MARGINS**

#### 1. VISIT TO NJANDUKULAM TRIBAL SETTLEMENT

Njandukulam is a tribal settlement near Mamalakandam in Ernakulam District. It is an abode of Muthuvan and Mannan tribes. On 31<sup>st</sup> June 2018, 2 teachers and 4 students from the college visited Njandukulam settlement and met their Mooppan Mr. George to know about their problems and challenges. Reaching there, the team conducted a socio-economic survey of the settlement. The survey revealed their economic status, exploitation by the non-tribals as well as the geographical hazards in their day to day life. From the survey we also came to know that only a few among them is educated and majority of them are illiterate. And their ignorance is always misused by non-tribes. The team offered the support of the college while interacting with them and assured them help in times of need.





## 2. VISIT TO NJANDUKULAM TRIBAL SETTLEMENT

Second visit to Njandukulam was on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2018. During this period they were facing the problems from heavy rain and flood. The purpose of the visit was to understand the requirements of the settlement and thereafter to provide necessary support. A team of 4 students and 2 teachers visited the site.



# 3. SUPPORT TO NJANDUKULAM TRIBAL SETTLEMENT

Third visit to Njandukulam tribal settlement was on 29.09.2018. Generally in the rainy season they are in utter poverty. During the time of flood their condition became very pathetic. Teachers and students of NSS unit of the college, collected food and clothing for them and handed over to them on 29.09.2018. 15 NSS volunteers along with Dr. G.S. Gireeshkumar, Principal of the college, Sri. Korah Jacob, Department of Economics, NSS Co-ordinators Dr. Nisha Joseph and Sri. Justin Joseph successfully completed the task.







### 4. VISIT AND SURVEY OF KURATHIKUDY TRIBAL SETTLEMENT

Kurathikudy, is a Muthuvan tribal settlement in the Idukki district. The settlement is in the inner forest of Mangulam forest range. On 3<sup>rd</sup>October 2019 a team of four members, Dr. Gireshkumar G. S., Principal, Mr. Justin Jose, NSS Programme Officer, Mr. Anish Thannikkal, Head, Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management and Dr. Nisha Joseph, NSS Programme Officervisited the Kurathykudy tribal settlement tolearn about the socio-economic profile of the people in the region. As it is a restricted area, entry is permitted to few.

As a first step, the team members visited Kudis and conducted a survey to find out the educated youngsters in the settlement. As a result, we got a list of 148 educated youngsters. Even though some of them have completed Higher Secondary education, they have not gone to higher education or are not employed. Others in the list are dropouts from

the school. Moreover, as the settlement is in a remote region, they lack communication facilities and are ignorant about the higher education facilities and employment opportunites. Many were first generation learners also. The team understood the need to support them.





### 5. KURATHIKUDY GRAMEENA VAYANASALA

On the basis of the first visit, the College decided to help them by establishing a library which includes various books on GK, books for competitive exams, novels and story books, books for primary school children, newspapers and employment news. The room was furnished and 416 books collected from students and teachers of the college, book shelves and other learning materials worth Rs. 1, 50, 000, were provided to the Kurathikudy library. Thus, the library became reality on 24<sup>th</sup> December 2019 with the inauguration of *KuruthikudyGrameenaVayanasala* by Dr. GireeshKumar G.S, Principal of the College. Our Students, Christy Elakannanand SanojKunjumon were also present on the occasion.











# 6. SPECIAL COACHING FOR JOB ASPIRANTS

During our third visit to Kurathikudy on 7<sup>th</sup>March 2020 their Kani (head of the Muthuvan tribes, Kurathikudy) Mr. Surya, who supported us in establishing the library, discussed with us the various hazards they were facing in their day today life. Lack of training for competitive examinations was one of the major challenges, their youth was facing. To support the community college decided to give training for various competitive examinations. For this, our alumni Mr. Santhosh Kunjumon who is the first graduate from Kurathikudy, was entrusted with. Four teachers and two students were enthusiastically involved in the project.



## **BEATING CORONA**

## 1. PRODUCTION OF SANITISER AND MASKS

With the increased demand for hand sanitizers and masks in the wake of the coronavirus scare, students have made low-cost sanitisers which met WHO guidelines. The teachers and students of the Department of Physics under the leadership of COVID Cell produced alcohol based hand sanitisers in their laboratory on 17<sup>th</sup> march 2020. The production was of immense significance at a time when there was a scarcity of hand sanitisers in market and frequent washing of hands is suggested as the most efficient measure to prevent the spread of the Covid-19. It was indeed a timely initiative and productive effort as many students utilised the opportunity when they came for University examination. Thirty five students and eight teachers took efforts to produce Masks and sanitiser.







#### 2. VIRTUAL INTERVIEW WITH DR. ANNA CHERIAN

Information is wealth, especially when we are fighting an invisible enemy. Therefore the Covid cell of the college organised a Virtual Interview with Dr. Anna Cherian, Andhra Pradesh on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2020 by using Zoom Cloud Application. The interviewer Ashmithalssac of Second B. Com extensively asked questions regarding various aspects of the epidemic and channelised valuable pieces information. She explored more about the symptoms of and precautions for this deadly disease. Dr. Anna Cherian provided us with scientifically proven facts regarding the nature of the virus and the disease. It, of course, helped us to keep distance from false information and wrong practices. The interview is uploaded on the official YouTube channel HBC EduHub. 10 students 3 teachers were actively involved in organising the programme.


## 6. VIRTUAL SHORT FILM



## MEGA JOB FAIR


