WHEREAS:

CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the institution and its related wings. - 1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. - 2.2 Curriculum Design: Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching/ training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaning fully.
- 2.3 Industrial Training& Visits: Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight into the latest developments /requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit its group companies and

- research activities in the fields of Education, Retail & Fashion, Automotive, Media & Entertainment, Travel & Leisure, Technology
- 2.5 Skill Development Programs: Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gap and make them industry ready.
- 2.6 Guest Lectures: Second Party to extand the necessary support to deliver guest lectures to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.7 Faculty Development Programs: Second Party to train the Faculties of First Party for imparting training as per the industrial requirement considering the National Occupational Standards in concerned sector, if available.
- 2.8 Placement of Trained Students: Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships rjobs; and will facilitate placements for attesst 10% of the students. The Second Party will itself absorb atteast 50 of the trained students.
- 2.9 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of what so ever nature required for offering the Programmes on the terms specified here in
- 2.10 There is no pre-financial commitment on either part of the parties to takeup any programme mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

CLAUSE3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall by express grant implication. Estoppelor otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest,or license in or to the intellectual property(including but not limited to know-how inventions patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

CLAUSE4 VALIDITY

4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period Vittree Business Solutions Private Limited the Second Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of Training Partner or Vittree Business Solutions. 

MOU with Micro Hard Systems

Henry Baker College , Melukavu has entered into an agreement with Micro Hard Systems, which is registered with Kerala State Pollution Board for the disposal of all e-waste in order to protect the campus and to conserve our natural and human resources. The contract was signed on 15^{th} February 2019 for a period of two years. Micro Hard system will collect all the e-waste from the campus and dispose the same in their plant at Muttom.



El-waste also contains toxic and hazardous materials in our Chemistry lab including mercury, lead, cadmium, beryllium, chromium, and chemical flame retardants, and other lab related items which have the potential to leach into our soil and water. It also includes the items used in Physics lab of the college.

For the purpose of this Agreement, the term "Waste Material" shall mean any and all electrical, electronic and hazardous waste material.

For the purpose of this agreement, the term "Hazardous Material" shall mean any and all hazardous material (storage devices, acids and chemicals), used in our laboratories for students' practical purposes.

For the purpose of this agreement, the term "Waste Management Services" is the services that are provided by contractor (M/s.Micro Hard Systems, Muvattupuzha) as directed by HBC, and including the handling. The rates as agreed between both the parties will be applicable.

The compensation for breach of this agreement will be as per the provisions of the Indian Contract Act, 1872 and any dispute between the parties will be settled through an arbitrator appointed by Henry Baker College as per the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.
