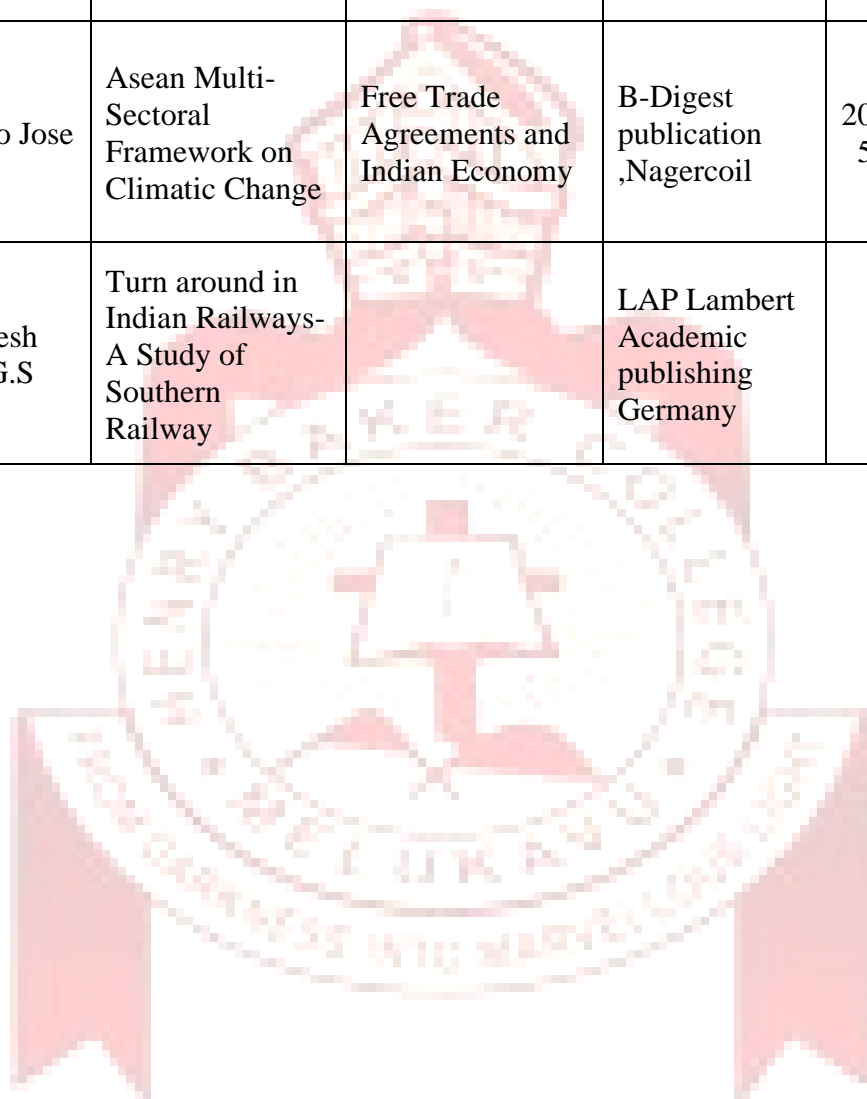

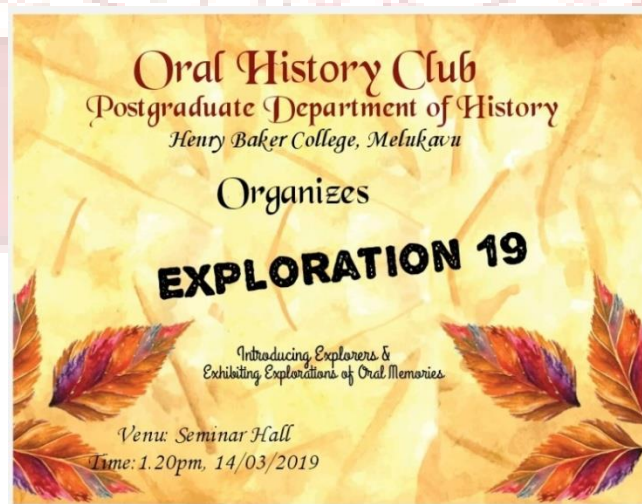

VISITS TO KNOWLEDGE HUBS

1. Tribal Visits

Visit to Kovilmala

On 5th January 2016, thirteen I MA students and teachers of the department visited, Kovilmala tribal settlement. The visit was to get first hand information about the tribal culture and life. For the first time students got the opportunity to visit a settlement and talk to a tribal king. The students were excited to see and talk to Kovilmala King Raman Raja Mannan, one and the only tribal king of Kerala. Meeting with the Raja rejuvenated their knowledge about tribal life, culture, customs, beliefs and practices. Students also met Elaya Raja, maternal uncle of the king. He also gave vivid description of tribal tradition and administration. The team visited the tribal temple nearby. They got the opportunity to see the crown and throne which was kept secret.

2. VISIT TO HISTORICAL SITES

Visit to Pattanam Excavation Site

Department of History conducted a study tour for IBA and II MA students on 11th March 2016. Students and teachers visited Muziris Heritage museum, Pattanam site, Pallipuram Fort, House of Sahodaran Aiyappan, Kodungallur Mosque etc. Muziris, was an early historical urban site and a centre of Indo- Roman trade on the Kerala coast, in early Christian centuries. Students got the opportunity to visit an archaeological site and understood how excavations are carried out. They saw the original artifacts like glass beads, gold ornaments, objects made of stone, copper and iron, Roman amphora, wharf with bollards and wooden canoe. 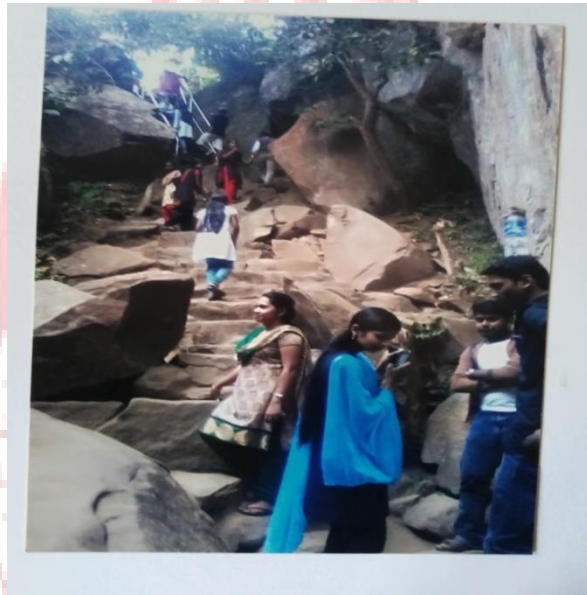

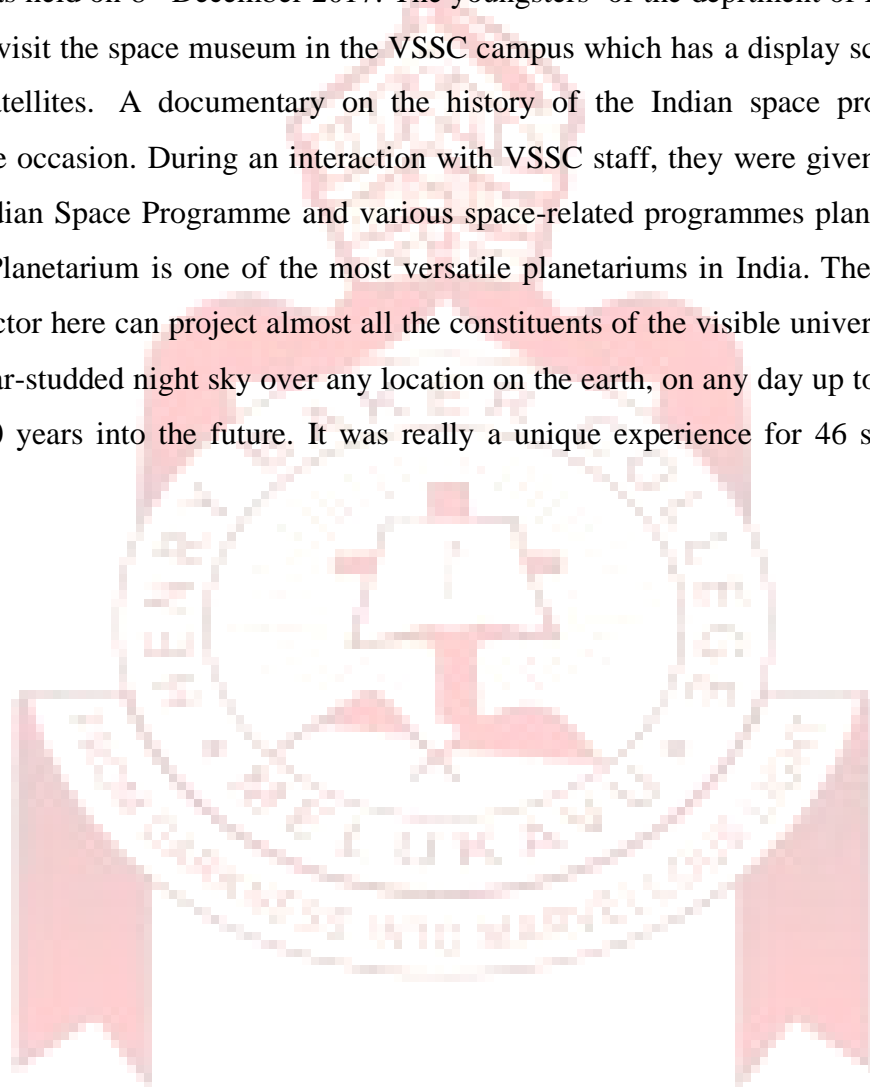

Priyadarshini Planetarium is one of the most versatile planetariums in India. The main GM-11 star field projector here can project almost all the constituents of the visible universe. It can also simulate the star-studded night sky over any location on the earth, on any day up to 12,500 years back or 12,500 years into the future. It was really a unique experience for 46 students and 3 teachers.
