Numerous learned articles had appeared in nationally and internationally acclaimed journals and edited volumes, and delivered lecturers in universities, research centres and professional associations of history worldwide.

Dr. Sanal Mohan was Smuts Visiting Research Fellow at the University of Cambridge; Post-Doctoral Visitors to the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity in Gottingen, Germany; Visiting Fellow to the Centre for the Advanced Study of India at the University of Pennsylvania; Director of the International Social History Workshop for Young Historians held at CODESRIA, Dark Senegal; Graduate School Postdoctoral Fellowship in Colonial and Post-colonial studies at the Department of History at Emory University, Atlanta; Fellow in History at the Centre for Study of Social Sciences, Calcutta; Charles Wallace India Fellow at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London; Honorary Research Associate of the Social Anthropology Programme, Massey University, New Zealand and a fellow of the Social science Research Council.


