


Editorial

Rev. Henry Baker (Jr.) Memorial Lecture

Rev. Henry Baker Memorial Lecture series of this academic Year was organized on 28th November 2017. The Chief Guest of the programme was Mr. Jiji Thomson Rtd. IAS officer and our former Chief Secretary of Government of Kerala. The meeting was presided over by Rev. Thomas George (Bishop Commissary). Dr. Gireesh Kumar G.S, College Principal welcomed the gathering. The lecture was on "Challenges for Evangelization in the Modern Era". He commemorated the pioneering efforts of Rev. Henry Baker to free lower castes from a state of servitude and shame. He talked about the tremendous task that was undertaken by Rev. Henry Baker (Jr.). Overcoming all the obstacles he came here to revive the young generation and fine tune them to the education system. He took initiative in reviving the unsophisticated sects. Mr. Jiji Thomson focussed on the challenges for evangelization. Youth should take the responsibility in disseminating the gospel. They should be daring enough to take courageously the challenges of evangelization.

Special Address was given by Rev. Dr. P T George (Treasurer, East Kerala Diocese). Rev. Biju Joseph and Adv. Mathew Joseph offered felicitations. Prof. Justin Jose, Convener of the programme, proposed the vote of thanks.



Dr. G S Gireesh Kumar has 24 years of teaching and research experience in various colleges in Kerala. He also holds MBA with specialization in Human Resource Management. He passed NET with JRF of University Grants commission in 1994. Dr. G S Gireesh Kumar had served as the Director (On Deputation), Centre for Continuing Education Kerala, an autonomous body established by the Government of Kerala under the Department of Higher Education. He also held the position of State Director of Kerala State Civil Service Academy, Institute of Fashion Technology Kerala, Institute of Career Studies and Research and Controller of Examinations, CCEK.

He has authored books on various subjects like Business Environment, Computer Awareness and Applications, Value Added Tax, Business Communication and MIS, India and Global Financial Crisis, Internet Banking published by (New Age International, New Delhi), Turnaround in

Indian Railways(Published by Lambard Academic Publications, Germany)etc. He produced 11 PhDs and 25 M.Phil Degrees under his supervision and guidance, presented papers in more than 100 national and international conferences and published more than 125 research papers in national and International journals of repute including Global Business Review, Decision (IIM C), International Journal of Management research, International Journal of Commerce, Business and researcher, Management Accountant, International Journal of Business Administration and Management, Asia Pacific Journal of Research, Indian Commerce Bulletin, Professional Banker, Journal of Bank Management, Journal of Social Welfare and Management, Insurance Chronicle, Southern Economist, Management Review etc. Under his leadership, CCEK made tremendous achievements and bagged Excellence Award for Best Training and Test Preparatory Institution from Emerging Kerala and DC Media. He has to his credit maximum number of UPSC Civil Servants (51) produced from Kerala State Civil Service Academy



during his tenure as the Director.

When Mahatma Gandhi University started Civil Service Institute, he was appointed as Academic Consultant. He is also elected member of the Principal Council of Kerala. He has been associated in varying capacities as Board of Studies Member, Examiner, Chairman of Board of Examiners, Question Paper Setter, Question Paper Scrutiny Board Member, Research Guide, PhD Adjudicator, Academic Counsellor, Visiting faculty, Resource person, Consultant etc with a number of Universities/Institutions like Mahatma Gandhi University, Madurai Kamaraj university, Kerala University, Bharathiar University, Christ University, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Kerala Public Service Commission, ICSI, ICFAI, IGNOU etc. He is also consultant to a number of government/non-government agencies.

He is the State General Secretary to Commerce Association of Kerala and State Executive Committee member of the Kerala Chapter of the Indian Accounting Association. Besides, he is Associate Member of the All India Management Association, Kerala Management Association, Micro-finance Research Foundation, Research Guides Forum, Global Consortium of Researchers etc. He has completed a number of research projects funded by University Grants Commission. He is the chief Editor / Editorial Committee Member of ISSN Numbered national/international research journals including Science and

Society, Indian Journal of Multidisciplinary Research, Indian Commerce Bulletin, Journal of Social Welfare and Management, Vision, Research Scholar, Business Orient, African Journal of Business and Management, APC International Journal etc.

He is the recipient of Bishop Vayalil Memorial award for Excellence and Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Fund Award for University topper. He won Rajiv Gandhi Gold Medal Award and Jawaharlal Nehru Gold Medal from Global Economic Progress and Research Association. He has presented a large number of research papers in national and international seminars/conferences abroad. He bagged Best Paper Award in National conference on Innovations in Banking at Coimbatore, International Conference at Phuket, Thailand, International Conference at Goa, International Conference at Jaipur etc. Also received various awards for best contributions in teaching, research, extension and consultancy. He chaired sessions in the international conference held in Thailand, World Finance Conference at Beijing, China, International conference at Goa and many other national and state level conferences. Countries visited and Research Papers Presented/Chaired sessions: other than International Conferences in India, Thailand, Malaysia, China, Singapore and United States.

EXCELLENCE DAY




Workshop on Oral History Archiving

Nature-walk at Thommankuthu Forest






"GRAMAVEEDHIYIL"


